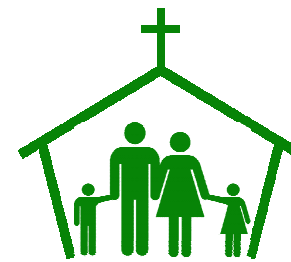

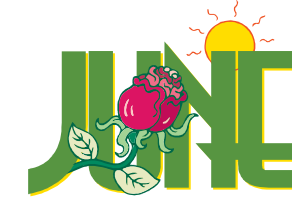

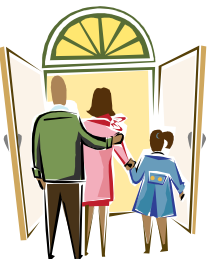

PENTECOST MOBILE

Make this craft as a reminder that God's Holy Spirit is all around you.

What you need:

- Tissue paper (red, yellow, orange), torn into squares
- Plastic transparency
- Craft glue
- Paintbrush
- Construction paper
- Black marker
- Wire hanger
- White copy paper
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Hole punch
- Fishing line

What you do:

- Overlap tissue squares as "flames" on the transparency.
- "Paint" glue (thinned with water) over the squares.
- Fold construction paper in half. Write out Acts 2:4 at the top, by the fold.
- Poke the hanger through the middle of the fold.
- On the white paper, write "Holy Spirit" in English, Spanish (*Espiritu Santo*), French (*L'esprit Saint*), etc.
- Cut out a flame pattern and trace it on the back of the transparency.
- Cut out flames and glue the "Holy Spirit" names on them.
- Thread fishing line through a hole atop each flame and tie flames onto the hanger.
